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
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STUDY KIT DISTRIBUTION FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN




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EXPO SIAS20


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Relief Kit and Food Kits Distribution

In association with the world food day, the department of food technology organizes a food distribution programme for the needy people in the streets. Our volunteers have been serving meals to the homeless once each year since 2012. The volunteers prepare the food at home and serve through the Kozhikode beach premises, railway station, Mananchira square were the major areas of food distribution. The department of food technology has student strength of 150 students who contributed one packet of meal each from their home.




Global Handwash day




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WEBINAR ON COVID 19 VACCINATION: ASK THE DOCTOR




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International Microorganism Day Celebration


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OPPORTUNITIES IN BIOSCIENCES FOR HIGHER EDUCATION ASPIRANTS


